# Trifle OR Treasure Bookmark

This saying was adapted from an original Victorian bookmark circa 1860's

# Materials Needed

**Stitch count:** 30 x 97, approx. 2 1/8" x 6 5/8"

Needle size: #24 tapestry needle

Perforated Paper: one 3" x 9" piece of 14 count paper The arrows point to the center of the design. Begin stitching in the middle of the paper at the center of the design.

### Stitching Fibers & Symbols

Suggested colors

Back stitch color for the words **DMC 310** Use size 12 PC or 1-2 strands of embroidery floss

border Back stitch O Cross stitch **DMC 311** Use size 8 PC or 2-3 strands of embroidery floss

Use the same color for the border Back stitch and Cross stitch.

#### Vinyl bookmark sleeve


A 2.5" x 7" sleeve from Clear Bags can be used to finish and protect the bookmark after the stitching is completed.

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
## Finishing the bookmark

The solid black lines on the bookmark chart suggest where to cut away the excess paper so that the stitched bookmark will fit in the



plastic sleeve. Do not cut away the excess paper until after the stitching is completed. Cut the paper so that the design is centered in the sleeve. A more traditional finishing option is to sew the completed bookmark onto a piece of ribbon or material.
